As a Centre of Excellence for a large and complex inventory of physical assets, the department comprises all the necessary functions and lines of business to ensure the full life-cycle management of the City of Barrie's facility and property portfolios.

Under the general guidance and direction of the Supervisor of Facilities, the Facility Services System HVAC Mechanic is responsible for planning and coordinating the installation, maintenance, or servicing of HVAC systems, components, accessories, and equipment for various City of Barrie facilities. This position installs, starts up, and verifies the operation and functionality of the HVAC system; installs and connects piping; maintains, services, repairs and replaces system components and accessories; and services, tests, adjusts, commissions and decommissions the HVAC system. Lastly, this position responds to, troubleshoots, and performs preventative, routine, and repair maintenance, including emergency repairs, on other non-HVAC related facility infrastructure, equipment and systems. Overall, this position plays an integral role in ensuring City facilities remain operational by maintaining and achieving maintenance goals, minimizing interruptions, and maximizing operational efficiencies.
