# **ABOUT THE ROLE**

The Director of Engineering reports to the Chief Administrative Officer and, working with the Strategic Management Team, has overall responsibility for the operations and maintenance of the Town's infrastructure and related services.

The scope of the Engineering Department includes roads and active transportation infrastructure, our parks and cemetery, transit service, environmental health services, building and fire inspection services, and the community's water utility.

The Director of Engineering is responsible for ensuring that the Engineering Department and its staff team are working within the priorities set out by Town Council, as well as human resource management and financial management of department budgets and plans.
