#### **SCOPE**

As the program lead, you will be responsible for recruiting, supervising, and evaluating a team of instructors, overseeing curriculum development including summer camps, coordinating staff, volunteer, and studio schedules, maintaining material inventory, promoting, and tracking registration, and developing community and outreach events. While occasionally required to teach a class, your primary focus is supporting instructors and working behind the scenes to ensure programs run smoothly. #### RESPONSIBILITIES

Working as part of a team, the Performing Arts Programmer will plan with the day-to-day development and marketing of programs and services, as well as program creation, planning, implementation, and evaluation, with a particular focus on educational programming. This includes researching and hiring instructors, registering programs in PRC Recreation Guide and PRCMS (Parks, Recreation and Culture Management System), booking space for programs at the Clayton Community Centre and across the City of Surrey and facilitating and supporting the programs at varying levels of involvement as required.

The Performing Arts Programmer will work in a dynamic arts environment and must excel at multitasking and meeting deadlines. Other required attributes include being creative, detail-oriented, with experience working with performing artists and a considerable understanding and knowledge of the performing arts community, cultural programs, their purpose, and objectives.
