## **CONDITIONS OF WORK:**

- Working conditions as per the CUPE Local 51 Collective Agreement.
- Must be certified or willing to be certified to install and inspect backflow prevention devices.
- The incumbent must have above-average initiative; judgment and ability to problem solve and perform the duties as outlined.
- The work requires a high level of attention and mental-sensory coordination with frequent short periods of concentration to details with moderate night and weekend work.
- May be required to supervise students or seasonal employees.
- Work hours are in accordance with the CUPE Local 51 Collective Agreement. Overtime may be required.
- Must be willing to take training and courses as it relates to plumbing.
- Work requires contact with employees of own department and various municipal departments, to discuss work methods and procedures requiring limited explanation.
- Frequent contact with suppliers and manufacturers relating to scheduling work, maintenance procedures and products etc.



- Requires attitudinal characteristics that reflect the best interests of the Corporation and the Community at large.
- The work requires considerable physical effort in a good working environment with only occasional exposure to disagreeable conditions.
- It is a condition of employment that the incumbent must be of the highest integrity and character and will be subjected to RCMP security screening. This involves background and character investigation of successful applicants and their immediate families. This is required prior to the necessary level of security clearance being granted for this position. Must maintain necessary RCMP security clearance requirements for this position throughout the duration of employment. Similarly, the incumbent's use of all police information will be in accordance with RCMP policy, regulations, and directives. Since the work is of a confidential nature, the incumbent must be prepared to undertake an Oath of Affirmation of Secrecy.
