- Review and approve contractor progress claims.
- Conduct infrastructure analysis and estimates and assist in the capital budget process.
- Provide engineering reviews, comments and inspections of the City's servicing components for new subdivision, condominium, site plan developments and redevelopment proposals.
- Provide technical advice, reviews and expertise utilizing standard engineering principles and practices.
- Perform detailed design, specification development and tender documents development for capital projects.
- Conduct on-site inspections and assessments of municipal infrastructure in a construction environment.
