What the role entails

The Community Planning Division is one of five Divisions within the Planning and Infrastructure Services Department. This dynamic department supports the growth and development of Clarington, the fastest growing municipality in the Region.

GIS staff complement the Community Planning Division that is responsible for strategic longrange planning including the Official Plan and the development of Secondary Plans. The Division reviews and implements Regional and Provincial Policy and supports both the Cultural Heritage and the Agricultural Advisory Committees of Council. The Planning and Infrastructure Services Department requires a GIS Technologist to support with all land development data management, spatial analysis and reporting, visualization, and technology needs. Reporting to the Manager of Community Planning, the GIS Technologist will work with the Municipality's Geographic Information System to manage and maintain geodatabases and associated metadata, undertake land use analysis, asset data analysis, as well as create mapping products.

Responsibilities

The following responsibilities and duties of this position includes but is not limited to:

- Maintain and monitor the day-to-day operation of the Planning and Infrastructure GIS system.
- Create, compile and maintain cartographic products, ensuring accuracy, realistic representation of features and high-quality design.
- Undertake spatial analysis using GIS databases and tools.
- Ensure the quality of the GIS data that powers the municipality's business solution, AMANDA, by continuous updates and quality control.
- Act as the departmental liaison with the Information Technology Division on corporate GIS
 including database infrastructure, organizational GIS strategy and data integrity.
- Update organizational data on regular intervals from providers such as MPAC, Teranet and other data sources.
- Use of 3-D modelling and visualizations to support the communication of complex concepts to the public.
- Training of staff on GIS products, as necessary.
- Answering or directing internal and external customer inquiries.
- Mapping lead for corporate projects (e.g. Ward Boundary Review, Municipal Elections).
- Development of partnerships with other levels of government and agencies to ensure our mapping layers are as current as possible.
- Coordinate and track data sharing arrangements.
- Identify opportunities for streamlined and automated workflows and establish data integrity procedures and processes.
- Developing and managing advanced web-based map applications for both internal staff and the public.
- Automating workflows to improve efficiency within the department.
- Other duties as may be assigned, including support for evening meetings.

Qualifications

The successful candidate will possess:

- Post-secondary degree or diploma in Geography, or related discipline, and a post graduate diploma in Geographic Information Systems or equivalent education and experience to the satisfaction of the Deputy CAO, Planning & Infrastructure Services.
- Post-secondary certificate or diploma in Asset Management from a recognized body would be an asset.
- Minimum of three years of experience in the application of ArcGIS software and spatial database creation and maintenance, preferably in a municipal planning environment.

- Excellent keyboarding skills with attention to detail.
- Advanced Proficiency in the MS Office suite of software, Adobe Acrobat, ArcGIS Pro, ArcGIS Urban, ArcGIS Server/Enterprise and ArcGIS Online.
- Strong working knowledge of database management (SQL, SDE, FGDB) and programming and scripting (Python, Arcade).
- Knowledge of municipal software such as AMANDA and Citywide along with experience in 3D GIS mapping would be an asset.
- Working knowledge of AutoCAD / Civil3D would be an asset.
- Must have excellent organization and communication skills, verbal, written and graphic.
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively in team situations or with minimal supervision, and able to meet tight deadlines.
- Exceptional customer service and interpersonal skills.
- Proven ability to learn new technologies quickly and maintain up-to-date knowledge of trends in geomatics industry.
- Strong problem-solving ability to provide guidance and solutions to non-GIS staff on mapping issues.
