This position will focus on the delivery of critical projects which are fast-paced, highly complex, and publicfacing. The Project Engineer will follow the City's procurement process and ensure projects meet City, engineering and legislative standards and protect public safety.

The Project Engineer will:

- Administer capital work projects through the project lifecycle of conception, design, construction and commissioning.
- Oversee the construction of municipal projects, including providing management, coordination and engineering support and guidance to consultants, contractors, technical and inspection staff to ensure compliance with the accepted design, City policies and by-laws, and the management of associated financial securities
- Procure or prepare design drawings and pre-construction estimates for infrastructure projects including water and wastewater treatment facilities.
- · Assist in the preparation of annual project budget by preparing cost estimates of projects
- Provide engineering reviews, comments and inspections of the City's servicing components for new subdivision, condominium, site plan developments and redevelopment proposals.
- Analyze engineering designs of Capital projects using computer systems and professional acumen.
- Provide technical advice, reviews and expertise based in engineering principles and practices
- Work collaboratively with a multi-disciplinary team of contractors, colleagues, elected officials, consultants, developers, and other internal and external clients and stakeholders

- Post-secondary degree in Civil or Mechanical Engineering preferred. Other disciplines will be considered.
- Registered and licensed as a Professional Engineer (P. Eng) with Professional Engineers of Ontario is required. Candidates that are within 6 months of meeting the requirements to obtain Professional Engineering (P.Eng) designation will be considered on an underfill basis.
