RESPONSIBILITIES

- Works with community groups to schedule events and programs in all facilities at the Cloverdale Fairgrounds.
- Supports the delivery of facility tours to prospective user groups and promotes the Cloverdale Fairgrounds as a site for future events.
- Schedules staff as required for programs and events.
- Liaises with internal and external contacts as necessary to support daily facility maintenance.
- Supervises junior staff.
- Manages the ordering and monitoring of supplies at the Cloverdale Fairgrounds.
- Administers facility availability for all programs, including cancellations and adjustments.
- Maintains a daily log of all incidents and deals effectively with all customer concerns.
- Ensures the City's policies and procedures are met during the performance of ongoing duties.
- Performs other duties as required.
