RESPONSIBILITIES

In this position, you will be:

- Supervising, training and reviewing work of junior staff; including assisting with scheduling and ensuring work is included in an efficient and timely manner;
- Assist in administering contracts for Parks Division work;
- Completing a variety of manual and semi-skilled tasks including but not limited to:
 - trail vegetation pruning
 - invasive plant removal
 - planting maintenance (weeding/brushing/mulching)
 - planting native trees and shrubs
 - refuse and yard waste removal
 - tree debris clean-up
 - inventorying assets
- Responding to service requests from the public;
- Preparing reports and maintaining records;
- Working on a team or alone completing heavy physical work in all weather conditions, requiring sufficient physical strength, stamina and coordination;
- Completing other related duties as required.

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The successful applicant:

- Is able to work independently as well as in a team environment and must be physically able to carry out the duties as required;

Plus a minimum of 2 years of recent experience in the management of natural areas.

- **OR** Completion of Grade 12 and a Technical Certificate Program (one year full-time) from an approved post-secondary institution, supplemented by 18 months of recent experience in the management of natural areas.
- **OR** Completion of Grade 12 and completion of a diploma program from an approved post-secondary institution, with a minimum of 6 months recent experience in the management of natural areas.
