

## **Position Overview**

Reporting to the General Manager of Community Services or designate, the Deputy Fire Chief (Charlie Lake Fire Department). On a day-to-day basis, reporting to the Fire Chief, the Deputy is responsible for the overall training program, which includes lesson planning, weekly training, preparing training budgets and organizing equipment. This position plays an integral role in the recruitment, selection and orientation of new volunteers, in addition to the continued training and engagement of the department's members. The Deputy Fire Chief will also be responsible for fleet maintenance, which includes repairs, insurance requirements and record keeping. The Ideal candidate will posses strong interpersonal and leadership skills and will excel at building effective working relationships with volunteers, the public, fellow Regional District staff and mutual aid partners.

- Knowledge and training of BCEMS and incident Command System (ICS); minimum ICS 300 completed
- Advanced computer skills, including the ability to produce reports and plans.
- A valid B.C. class 3 Driver's Licence with air brake endorsement
- A satisfactory review of a current criminal record and vulnerable sector check is required
