Reporting to the Water Quality Supervisor, the **Water Treatment Plant Co-op Student** assists the Water Treatment Plant operations teams in performing operational and maintenance work. This involves performing operational and maintenance duties in order to maintain water quality that meets or exceeds all compliance criteria outlined in City's Permit and Provincial and/or Canadian Drinking Water Legislation.

Key Responsibilities:

- Assist in the observation of gauges, meters, and control panels and advises the WTP operator accordingly.
- · Assist in the operation of water treatment plant processes.
- Performs maintenance of water treatment plant processes.
- Perform laboratory tests and take water quality and beach samples as required.
- · Other reasonable duties as required.

Required Knowledge, Abilities & Skills:

- Knowledge of British Columbia regulations, operating permits, and City policies.
- Ability to perform multiple tasks, establish priorities, and respond calmly and efficiently in an emergency situation.
- Ability to express ideas clearly and effectively both orally and in writing and execute both oral and written instructions.
- Thorough knowledge of applicable safety regulations, standards, policies, and procedures.
- Proficient in the use of computers including spreadsheet, database, and word processing applications.


