Position Title: Park Worker (Multiple Positions)

Position Status: Full-Time Temporary / Temporary Reduced-Time

Learn new skills and earn competitive wages. Help us to sustainably manage and maintain regional parks for the safety of visitors and the integrity of ecosystems.

PURPOSE OF POSITION:

Under immediate supervision of Park Operator, to perform unskilled labour work required in the operation and maintenance of parks. Participates actively on Area team to achieve Departmental goals.

THIS ROLE: *(The duties described hereunder are intended to be representative of the position and are not to be considered as all inclusive).*

- Performs a variety of routine maintenance duties, such as: grass cutting and trimming; planting flowers and shrubs; maintenance of trails, buildings, picnic and camp sites; repair of tools; washing and staining tables; bridge and boardwalk repairs; garbage collection and litter pick up; and cleaning toilet facilities.
- Assists with construction improvements in parks, such as bridges, trails, culverts, buildings, boardwalks, gates, fences, corrals, water lines and docking facilities.
- Operates and maintains (lubrication, running adjustments, clean up) equipment such as: small diesel tractors and attached mowers, trucks, push mowers, weeders, vacuums, chainsaws and rock drills.
- Provides advice to park users on park regulations. Informs appropriate staff regarding violations.
- Provides information and assistance to the public. Maintains records and reports.
- Patrols park areas as required.

TO BE SUCCESSFUL, YOU HAVE:

- Grade 10 (or equivalent).

- Valid Class 5 or Class 7 BC Drivers' License.
- Health certificate for watershed entry.
- Be in good physical condition and capable of walking long distances.
- Be able to deal with the public in a courteous and effective manner.
- Some knowledge in operating machinery as mentioned above.
- Good English language communication skills.
- Basic First Aid certification is preferred (plus Bronze Cross where appropriate).

POSSIBLE TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES:

Wildfire Suppression (S-100), Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS), Occupational First Aid (Level 1), Equipment Operations (such as small tractor, ride-mower, weed eater, chainsaw), Safe Boating Operations, Radio Communications, Bear Awareness, Incident Command System (ICS), Workplace Safety and more.

WAGE RATE:

\$32.91/hour plus 6.25% deferred compensation.

WORK TERMS:

Vary from two to ten months year round at most regional parks.

HOURS OF WORK:

Full-time positions work 40 hours per week. Reduced-time positions vary from 16 to 24 hours per week.
