We are currently seeking a Shade Trees Coordinator (Parks Operations Coordinator) for our Urban Forestry team. This position includes an advanced level of professional work related to the planning, coordination, and delivery of a full range of operational and capital programs relating to the City of Surrey's Shade Tree program.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Responsibilities include preparing and monitoring annual work plans and budgets, evaluating capital works projects, leading shade tree renovation projects, and working effectively with a wide variety of stakeholders, agencies, and volunteer groups that interact with the City of Surrey's urban forest.

As well, you will:

- prepare contracts, budgets, applications for grants and donations, and monitor programs to ensure that they are delivered within budget.
- assist in policy and procedure creation and analysis.
- supervise staff and promote a strong team environment.
- prepare and present reports to advisory committees and management.
- develop, review, and implement technical standards, drawings, plans, reports, work programs, projects, and operational work procedures.
- assist in the development, award, and supervision of contracts.
