Duties include the development and delivery of community fire and life safety education programs, conducting community risk analyses, coordinating fire service participation at special events, programs, etc. Additionally, the incumbent will assist in the development and maintenance of an effective public relations strategy. As the Public Fire and Life Safety Educator, you will perform the following duties, including but not limited to:

- Development and delivery of community fire and life safety education programs and messages including evacuation planning and procedures, fire extinguisher demonstrations, school talks, careers fairs, and public relations presentations.
- Participates in programs and projects including Home Safe Home programming, health fairs, small business seminars, holiday fire safety, children's festivals, high-rise seminars, Emergency Management, Fire Prevention and Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week(s).
- Collects data and prepares regular reports related to the department's Fire and Life Safety Education efforts.
- Writes or supervises the writing of newspaper columns, media releases, public service announcements, and other information.
- Maintains a schedule of varied public interest committees, events and activities and coordinates participation of appropriate staff.
- Prepares instructional and public information programs for use of departmental personnel. Develops and manages public education program scheduling for department operating units.
- Prepares lectures, displays, demonstrations and other special projects.
- Develops and maintains panels, booths, visual aids, and other graphic aids to be used in presentations.

The ideal candidate will have demonstrated aptitude for fire prevention/inspections and public fire and life safety education. We are seeking an individual with superior verbal and written communication/presentation skills, a demonstrated skills for the delivery of public and life safety education, and excellent interpersonal skills.
