- Strong understanding of blueprints, diagrams, and written instructions.
- Supervisory skills to manage assistants effectively.
- B.C. Certificate of Qualification (Carpenter).
- Valid Driver's License for the Province of British Columbia.

- Completion of the 10th grade, supplemented by technical courses related to the trade.
- Recognized apprenticeship completion and relevant journeyman experience.
- Class 3 or Heavy Hauler Certification (an asset).
