JOB SUMMARY

Public Health Inspectors (PHIs) are responsible for delivering health protection programs and services in Niagara Region. PHIs carry out public health activities required by the Ontario Public Health Standards, under the Health Protection and Promotion Act (HPPA). PHIs require a variety of professional and technical skills for conducting risk assessments, inspections, as well as investigations of health hazards. PHIs must enforce the Ontario Protection and Promotion Act and its associated regulations; they may be required to issue tickets, summons, and to testify in court. PHIs also provide consultative and educational services on diverse topics that affect public health, with the intention of reducing public health hazards and improving community health.
