The Deputy Fire Chief ensures that services are delivered effectively, safely, and in compliance with all applicable regulations, municipal policies, and industry best practices.

As a senior leader, the Deputy Fire Chief supports strategic planning, operational readiness, and continuous improvement within the department. This role requires strong leadership, decision-making, and problem-solving skills to maintain a high standard of emergency services. The Deputy Fire Chief will act as Fire Chief in their absence.

#### **ABOUT NELSON FIRE & RESCUE SERVICES**

Nelson Fire & Rescue Services is a progressive composite fire department dedicated to serving the community of Nelson, British Columbia—a vibrant city with a population of approximately 13,000. The department operates with a team of 13 full-time career firefighters represented by the IAFF, supported by 21 Paid-on-Call members. Together, they respond to approximately 1,700 emergency calls annually.

Operating from one of the oldest continuously active firehalls in Western Canada, built in 1913, the department maintains a versatile and well-equipped fleet. This includes two fire engines, an 85-foot aerial platform, a 1,500-gallon water tender, and a utility vehicle. In addition, the department is equipped with specialized trailers for sprinkler operations and technical rescue/hazardous materials response.
