We are seeking instructors who can teach a variety of Theatre styles – such as Improv and Theatre Games - and are comfortable teaching to all ages. Our Performing Art Program Instructors have the opportunity to teach classes to preschool, children, youth and adult participants throughout the year and to participate in hands-on outreach community activities across Surrey.

Responsibilities

- Submit detailed lesson plans and supply lists for each class, camp, or workshop.
- Set-up and clean-up of each class.
- Teach group theatre classes.

- Education and experience in teaching the fundamentals of improvisation, comedy, and dramatic arts.
- Able to assess age appropriateness of lessons and materials and modify lessons as needed based on student's abilities.
- Strong communication, interpersonal, and relational skills with participants and staff.
- Effective problem-solving skills.
- The ability to work both independently and collaboratively within a team.

The successful candidate must have:

- A degree/diploma in Theatre, Performance, or a related field.
