SCOPE

Reporting to the Manager of Facilities Maintenance and Operations, the Chargehand – Electrician will perform varied trades work of a supervisory nature and assists senior supervisory staff in the direction, supervision and planning of the crews in building maintenance and construction projects.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist senior supervisory staff in the planning, direction, and supervision of the work of the crews in electrical trades in construction and maintenance of City facilities and buildings.
- Assist crew members in installing, repairing, and maintaining electrical systems, fixtures, light and heat systems.
- Assist in preparing work schedules, determining materials and equipment required.
- Assist in ensuring work performed by the trades and others is completed efficiently and on schedule.
- Ensure safety regulations are being met by the crews.
- Performs other job duties as required.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Completion of Grade 12.
- Considerable experience in supervision, building maintenance and construction as a qualified trades electrician.
- Electrical Trades Qualification.
- Class B FSR certification.
