What your key role will be

As a Victim Assistance Caseworker, you will contribute to our continued success by providing crisis intervention and direct support services to those impacted by crime and/or trauma, as well as follow up support after the incident. You will work as part of a team under the leadership of a Victim Assistance Unit Coordinator, and alongside another Victim Assistance Caseworker; as well you will also provide mentorship and on-going guidance to auxiliary staff within the unit.
