- Introduction to Sewer Pump and Lift Station Maintenance as well as Electrical Safety and Trouble Shooting for Lift Station, considered an asset.
- You have considerable knowledge of the standard practices, methods, tools and equipment used in the maintenance, repair, inspection and operation of pump stations and systems.
- You have considerable knowledge of the hazards and safety precautions required in the work.
- You have the ability to inspect operations, diagnose and correct malfunctions, and perform routine maintenance, repair and installation on pump equipment and systems.
- You have the ability to understand and carry out oral and written instructions and perform work under minimal supervision.
- You have the ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with coworkers.
- You have the ability to read and interpret meters and gauges, requisition parts and materials, and prepare and maintain records required in the work.
- You have the ability to perform duties under minimal supervision.
- You have skill in the use and care of tools and equipment used in the work.
- Class 3 driver's license with air brake endorsement is preferred.
- You must successfully pass and maintain a clear Police Information Check.
