This role:

- Develops and prepares regulatory proposals such as new or amended bylaws on the discharge of contaminants within liquid waste to the sewer system in accordance with established liquid waste management plans.
- Identifies issues requiring regulatory, education and/or outreach solutions and researches and recommends related strategies; coordinates with staff in other departments on the development of education and outreach initiatives and on bylaw implementation strategies. Prepares issue papers, reports and detailed recommendations for consideration of senior staff; develops and delivers presentations and workshops.
- Develops, revises and recommends fee formulas and schedules for regulatory and other services provided by Metro Vancouver.
- Develops, recommends and implements consultation plans to obtain input on proposed regulatory and fee initiatives from the regulated community, and, as appropriate, the public.
- Liaises with the regulated community, member municipalities, the provincial government and Metro Vancouver utilities to consider regulatory and other alternatives to address liquid waste objectives.

- Coordinates cross-departmental source control activities for liquid waste management; as required, oversees the work of consultants.
- Advises on divisional business processes for the development of software applications.
- Performs related work as required.

To be successful, you have:

- Diploma or degree in environmental science combined with a master's degree in planning plus sound related experience, or an equivalent combination of training and experience.
- Considerable knowledge of the principles, practices, and objectives of environmental planning.
- Considerable knowledge of bylaws and legislation related to liquid waste management, and of applicable departmental objectives, policies, rules and regulations.
- Considerable knowledge of established liquid waste management plans related to the work performed.
- Considerable knowledge of research methods, statistical techniques, trends and developments related to the work.
