- Plans and constructs and/or repairs concrete formwork as well as wood frame, concrete or steel structures.
- Plans and performs finish carpentry including the construction of office furniture and cabinetry.
- Trains, directs, assigns, oversees and reviews the work and activities of subordinates including carpenters, helpers and apprentices.
- Assists with the development of safe work procedures related to MV construction projects.
- Develops or assists with the development of construction cost estimates and project schedules.
- Works in compliance with Corporate, Departmental and WorkSafeBC standards and regulations.
- Operates and maintains both manual and power tools utilized by MV carpentry staff.
- Maintains personal protection equipment in accordance with manufacturers instructions and according to Corporate, Departmental and WorkSafeBC standards and regulations.

- Performs manual labour duties including but not limited to, shoveling dirt and granular materials, concrete finishing, carrying and placing reinforcing steel, housekeeping and clean-up of work sites and carpentry shop.
